They will be interviewed by our moderator, Bill Mongelluzzo, Senior Editor, Journal of Commerce.



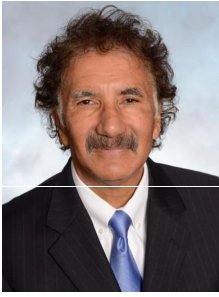
**Gene Seroka, Executive Director
